

# Hemp History Week Photo Sharing Tips

Sharing photos and collecting signatures are the two BEST ways to highlight the strength of our national campaign.

#### Before your event:

- Enlist one or more people to take photos. Ideally, find a volunteer with a great eye! Experience has taught us you will be too busy talking with folks or taking care of last-minute details to take photos, no matter how good your intentions!
- Consider a 'shot list'. With your photographer, make a list of the shots you'd like to collect. Examples: your creative hemp display, people signing letters, a performer on stage, etc.

### During event:

- Snap away! If you are using a cell phone please set it to the best resolution.
- Collect names and photo credits for captions.

#### Post-event:

- Share as soon as possible. Consider posting a few photos to Facebook during your event, then send your best album in the days following (see below)
- Include photo credits and/or captions
- Remember to tag @HempHistoryWeek in your photos on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Pinterest.
